# She's in the frame

**L**ike thousands of other teenagers, Hannah Pusey adored the film *Mamma Mia*. She was so inspired by the movie that she wrote a review.

Now her 250 word piece has won her the title of Young Film Critic of the Year and the 15-year-old from Liss was invited to a glittering awards ceremony at the British Academy of Film and Television Arts (Bafta) in London to receive it.

The award and a framed certificate now has pride of place in the Pusey household in Huntsbottom Lane.

Hannah was one of four nominated finalists in her age group but it was not until a gold envelope was opened on

the presentation night and her name was read out that she knew she had won.

"I entered the competition in July or August last year, but there were so many entries that it took a year to read through them all. **Film Education**, which runs the competition, rang my head of English at school on September 23 to say that I was one of the finalists, so it was quite a tense month," she said.

Hannah, who goes to Alton Convent School, saw *Mamma Mia* with her family in Guildford.

"It is very popular with teenagers because it is such a fun movie. I knew about the stage show, and I really wanted to see what the movie was like and it was as good as I hoped."

Hannah read about the Young Film Critic of the Year Competition on the internet, and submitted her entry just before the deadline.

"I went a little bit over the 250 word limit, but that doesn't seem to have counted against me," she said.
